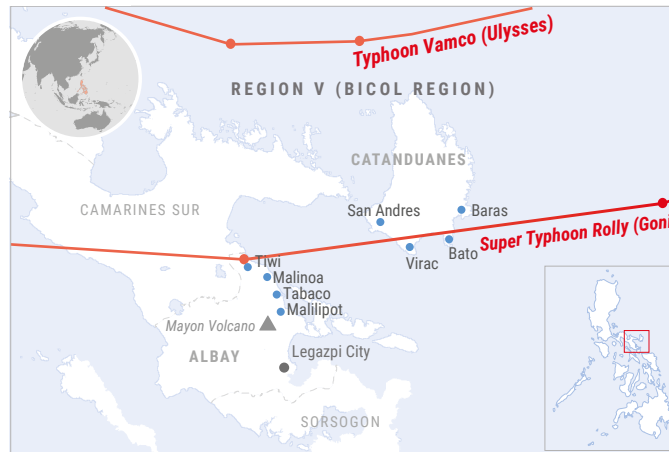
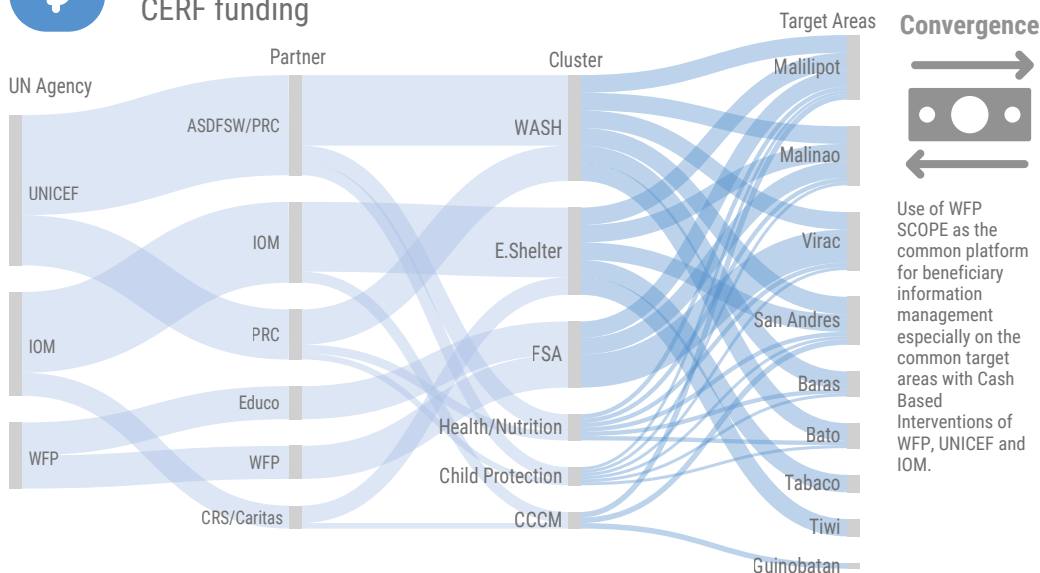


On 1 November 2020, Super Typhoon Goni, (Rolly) brought torrential rains, violent winds, mudslides and storm surges to Luzon that caused extensive destruction and damage affecting more than 3 million people.

The initial Humanitarian Needs and Priorities document was launched to address immediate humanitarian needs of the areas hardest hit by Super Typhoon Goni. Subsequently, the Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF) approved an allocation of \$3.1 million (Php 150 million) for the Philippines to IOM, UNICEF and WFP. Working with local partners, the three agencies were able to provide life-saving assistance and accelerated stabilization of conditions faced by affected population and at-risk communities.

### WASH

**50k** Target population

#### KEY ACTIVITIES

- Rehabilitation and construction of WASH facilities
- Distribution of water and hygiene kits
- Technical assessment of damaged WASH facilities
- Hygiene promotion

#### CHALLENGES

- COVID-19 movement restrictions
- Frequent rain that hampered construction work
- Delays in delivery of supplies
- Limited immediate access to hardware supplies
- Lack of coordination between local government and other organization service providers / stakeholders.

### E. Shelter/CCCM

**10.3k** Target population

#### KEY ACTIVITIES

- Distribution of Shelter Repair Kits (SRK)
- Capacity-building orientation for SRK beneficiaries
- Cash-based interventions to augment additional repair materials and labor cost
- Emergency repair work for most affected ECs through Cash-for-Work scheme
- Distribution of modular tents, PPEs, COVID19 IEC materials

#### CHALLENGES

- Lack of livelihood assistance
- Lack of support for relocation for permanently displaced populations.

### Health/Nutrition/Child Protection

**50k** Target population (Health/Nutrition)      **25.8k** Target population (Child Protection)

#### KEY ACTIVITIES

- Distribution of Ready-to-Use Therapeutic Food (RUTF)
- Established Child Friendly Space (CFS) with trained CFS volunteers
- Established local referral pathway for child protection
- IPC and nutrition training

#### CHALLENGES

- Timing of implementation
- Unfavorable weather conditions
- Access to, availability and cooperation of communities
- Need for further validation of available data
- Limited supply of essential medicine and equipment.

### Food Security and Agriculture

**15k** Target population

#### KEY ACTIVITIES

- Registration of beneficiaries (WFP, IOM and UNICEF) using SCOPE
- Distribution of conditional and unconditional cash assistance to beneficiaries
- Partnership with DSWD R5 to use SCOPE for beneficiary information and intervention management

#### CHALLENGES

- Limited number of families served against the number of poor families needing assistance
- COVID-19 pandemic restrictions and limited mobility for beneficiaries to access their assistance
